THE SYMPOSIUM

The Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and the Carolinas HealthCare System/Charlotte AHEC jointly present this symposium to provide practicing pathologists and pathology trainees with a review of Current Concepts and Diagnostic Challenges in Gastrointestinal, Liver, and Pancreatic Pathology.

The keynote speaker is Dr. John Woosley, MD, PhD, from the University of North Carolina, who will present the 16th annual Walter R. Benson Lecture titled Biopsy Interpretation of Gastrointestinal Tract Tumors. Dr. Woosley is a nationally-recognized pathologist and educator with particular interest and expertise in neoplasia of the gastrointestinal (GI) tract and liver.

Additional topics covered by the speakers will include infectious and inflammatory disorders of the GI tract, lymphomas of the GI tract, neoplastic and non-neoplastic lesions of the liver and pancreas, and molecular testing in GI pathology. Ample time will be provided for discussion and personal interaction between the faculty and attendees.

Following the conference, all attendees are cordially invited to attend a dinner honoring Susan Maygarden, MD, outgoing Residency Program Director.
