Goal:

2. Describe the proper use of key vaccines, including but not limited to, influenza, pneumococcal, shingles, tetanus (Td/Tdap), human papillomavirus (HPV) and hepatitis B vaccines.
3. Utilize CDC recommendations to determine needed vaccines for a patient.
4. Identify resources to stay up-to-date on vaccine-related information.

Pharmacy Technician Course Objectives:

At the completion of this knowledge-based activity, the participant should be able to:

1. Identify vaccines commonly available at the pharmacy for childhood and adult immunization.
2. Understand the importance of the vaccine information sheet and requirements of its distribution.
3. Recognize successful methods and roles of the pharmacy technician for increasing access to information and provision of vaccines available at the pharmacy.
